Will this housing have security?

Will students be moving into this community? It is single adult housing, not families or children.

Concern about students traveling alone past this housing complex.

Will the housing have liability?

Have we spoken with the San Rafael police department about what they have seen in response to their housing? They will be meeting with the Marin County Sheriff's department to further discuss in the coming weeks.

Where are we in the process? The county has approved moving forward and submitting the application, but we will find out in December if we have been approved. Financing also has to be determined. There will be community meetings.
